Improve your life, apply for the Franklin County CBCT Building Futures program

The Columbus/Central Ohio Building and Construction Trades Council proudly partners with Franklin County and IMPACT Community Action to offer residents a path to the middle class.

Building Futures is a 12-week program that provides the skills needed to begin a career in the region's booming construction industry.

No experience in the construction industry is necessary or required to apply.

A career with one of the affiliated trades (*see list on right*) will provide participants with a great starting wage, health benefits and retirement benefits.

After the **successful** conclusion of the 12-week training program, participants will have a pathway into a registered apprenticeship program.

Individuals who are interested in the Building Futures program should:

- Have an interest in the building trades as a career.
- Have the physical ability to perform the work of the trades.
- Pass a drug test.

Attendance is required and strictly adhered to for participants to successfully complete the program.

How to qualify

Minimum Candidate Qualifications:

- Completed application
- Drug-free
- 18 years of age or older
- High school diploma or GED equivalent
- Passing Assessment score (*ACT WorkKeys and McGraw Hill - ALEKS*)

All applicants that meet the above criteria will be interviewed and assigned a score used to determine which applicants will be selected for a training cohort. Those not selected will have the opportunity to be chosen for future cohorts.
